As directed by the Tennessee Code, public libraries operate under policies set by a board of trustees. The members of the board are appointed by the local funding bodies—in our case, the Lawrence County Commission and the City of Lawrenceburg. The board meets on the first Tuesday of January, March, May, July, September and November.
